Terry O'Shea, who is best known for small plastic sculpture made from many layers of colored acrylic, which appears clear when seen from above, has done few outdoors works. Foney Rock entailed the selection of a single pebble by a friend who delivered it to the artist's studio where O'Shea meticulously duplicated it—and replaced his facsimile on the original site. The work shows a nice sense of measure and a certain ecological sensitivity, very different in mood from the large scale rapings enjoyed by other outdoor artists.
